COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER CONNECTIONS IN ACTION...

VIP/TTV: Supported Volunteering



The **Volunteer Integration Program** helps people with developmental disabilities to volunteer.

Transitions Through Volunteering helps adults with mental illness make volunteering part of their

mental health recovery. Together, these programs supported **117** individuals to contribute more than **4,522** hours of volunteering.

The **CVC Flying Squad** grew to **290** members, who helped out at **82** events this year. Wow!

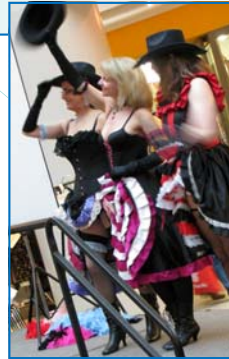
