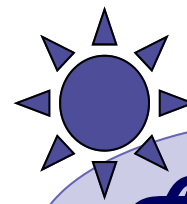

Advocacy & Consulting

At the provincial level, CVC's advocacy resulted in changes to the Criminal Record Review policy allowing Managers of Volunteers choice between provincial and police checks. Locally, CVC worked with Crossroads Hospice to develop a **society-wide volunteer recognition program**; became host agency for the **Tri-Cities Seniors Planning Network**; assisted the Canadian Mental Health Association to launch the first **Youth Anti-Stigma Summit**; and built the framework for the **Mystery Volunteers Project** (more info coming soon!)
